Blocking "Only One" of the Two Curb Cuts?

It might seem okay to block one of two curb cuts on a corner, but this is not the case. It can be misleading to drivers when they see a wheelchair user crossing in one direction when they end up turning and crossing to the right or left of what it looked like they were doing. Sometimes this can lead to a collision!

Curb Cuts Help Everyone

But they're mainly for wheelchair users, so keep them clear!

Curb cuts—the ramps cut into sidewalks at sidewalk crossings—not only increase mobility and freedom for People Living with Disabilities (PLD), they also help people pushing strollers, riding on skateboards, using roller-blades, riding bicycles and pushing shopping carts. In other words, curb cuts help everyone—but only if they can be used!
